The June Members' Meeting will be held on **Saturday, June 20, 2015** at **6:30 PM** at the **Carriage House** at the Museum on Jackson Street. The program will be a talk by Christopher Daley on **The**

Lincoln Assassination in 1865. This April marked the 150th anniversary of that tragic event in our nation's history.

According to the website of Christopher Daley Historical Presentations, "This lecture is the result of many years of research and travel. ... (It) begins with a short synopsis of the backdrop of the Civil War leading into an examination of the plot to kidnap Lincoln and how that plot developed into a scheme to assassinate him. Both Lincoln and Booth's movements during the day of the assassination are meticulously chronicled And then,... the assassination is recounted in stunning detail. The escape and capture of John Wilkes Booth is fully described The lecture concludes with a vivid description of the trial of all of the conspirators and execution of the four of them."

Reports on Recent Events...

Herring Run Festival

The Association again set up a booth at the 2nd Annual Herring Run Festival at Oliver Mill Park to help spread the word to all those who stopped by about who we are and what we do. The crowds were bigger than last year; in fact, Sunday afternoon a THIRD full-size coach from Plymouth and Brockton Street Railway Company was brought in to help accommodate the continuous long line of people waiting to be shuttled across Rt. 44 after parking in the KOA campground property. Both days were warm and sunny, though more than a bit breezy on Saturday.

We started to advertise the two upcoming fundraising events (see above) and to sell raffle tickets for the American Girl doll. We also had items for sale and displays about the Museum and Judge Oliver. A popular draw was the collection of wooden toys of yesteryear which a lot of children tested out – “no batteries required!”

Manning our booth were Bob and Cheri Reimels, Dorothy Thayer, Nancy Thomas, Stet Thomas, Dan and Jane Thompson and Doug and Kay Vantran.

April Members’ Meeting

On April 8, 2015, our first quarterly members’ meeting of this year was held at the Middleborough Public Library in the lower-level meeting room. A brief business meeting was held. A quorum of members being present, the following votes were taken: **Insurance:** A motion was passed to authorize the Treasurer to pay \$6,000.00 for the annual insurance bill. **Door Repairs:** A motion was passed to authorize the President to go ahead and repair doors at the Museum for a total of \$1,983.00.

The meeting room was filled to capacity for the program, which consisted of a special visit from former “First Lady Eleanor Roosevelt” in the person of actress Judy Bernstein. This program was supported in part by a grant from the Middleborough Cultural Council, a local agency which is supported by the Massachusetts Cultural Council, a state agency. Light refreshments were served after the program.

It was wonderful to see so many members out for the April Members’ Meeting!!! It would be just as exciting to see at least that many members attend each of the quarterly members’ meetings, even when “Eleanor Roosevelt” is not able to visit!!

Two Former A&P Locations

With the closing on Sunday, May 10, 2015 of long-running business *Maria’s Card & Gift Shop* on the ground floor of the massive three-story Peirce Block at the corner of North Main and Center Streets, there is now a second former A&P (The Great Atlantic & Pacific Tea Company, Inc.) grocery

store location laying fallow in Middleboro’s business district.

The Peirce Block was the second location of the A&P store; it first occupied the corner of Center Street and Thatcher’s Row, where Coffee Milano is now. It operated in the Peirce Block from the 1950s until 1962, when a brand-new, modern A&P supermarket was built in Everett Square. Its former Peirce Block location became for many years the site of *The Bottle Shop* until that business moved to its current site in a plaza of businesses on West Grove Street. It was after The Bottle Shop vacated the space that Maria’s moved from its previous site on South Main Street where Millbrook Realty is now.

This changing of locations is a recurring theme in the history of downtown Middleboro. There is a long and interesting history of how various and numerous businesses played the “game” of “musical stores” as they moved from location to location.

The A&P in its new building in Everett Square served as what we now call an “anchor store” in a small plaza of businesses which also housed a pharmacy, a liquor store and a bank branch with a drive-thru window. This was the third and last location of the A&P in Middleboro, where it remained until it was closed around 1976. The small grocery chain *Babaian’s* followed there but was in business for just a few years. In 1985, *Middleborough Trust Company* took over the building and, after remodeling the former supermarket space, moved its original main office from its longtime location across Center Street from what would be the last location of Maria’s.

A number of years later, Middleborough Trust was purchased by *Rockland Trust Company*, which made the Everett Square location one of its many branches in the region until 2013, when it purchased Mayflower Co-operative Bank and moved its branch operations to the former Mayflower main branch located across South Main Street from the earliest site of Maria’s Card & Gift Shop. “Musical stores” INDEED!!
